

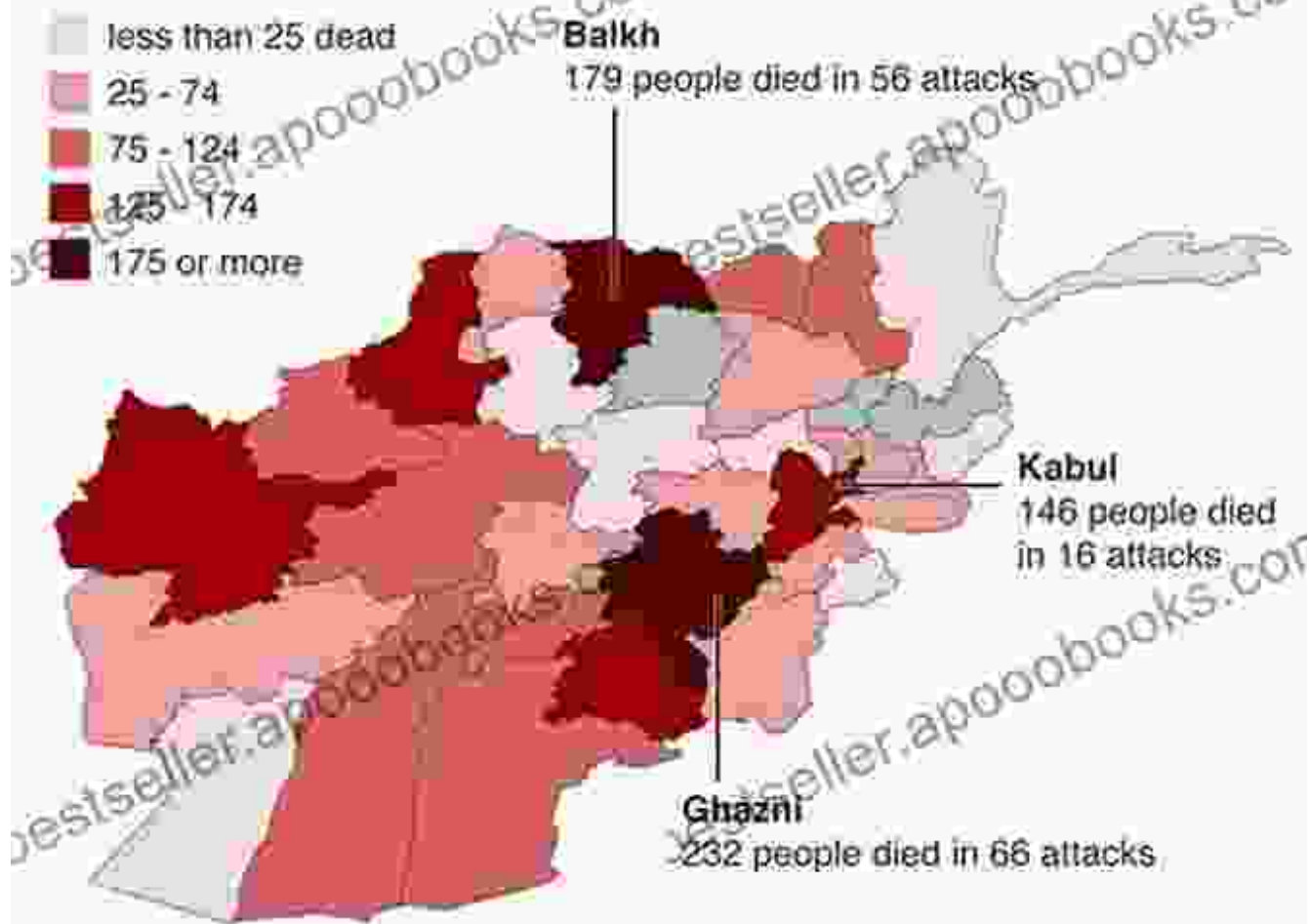

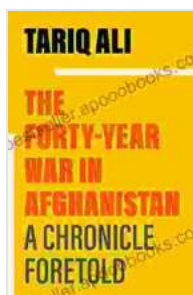
Violent conflict covered Afghanistan

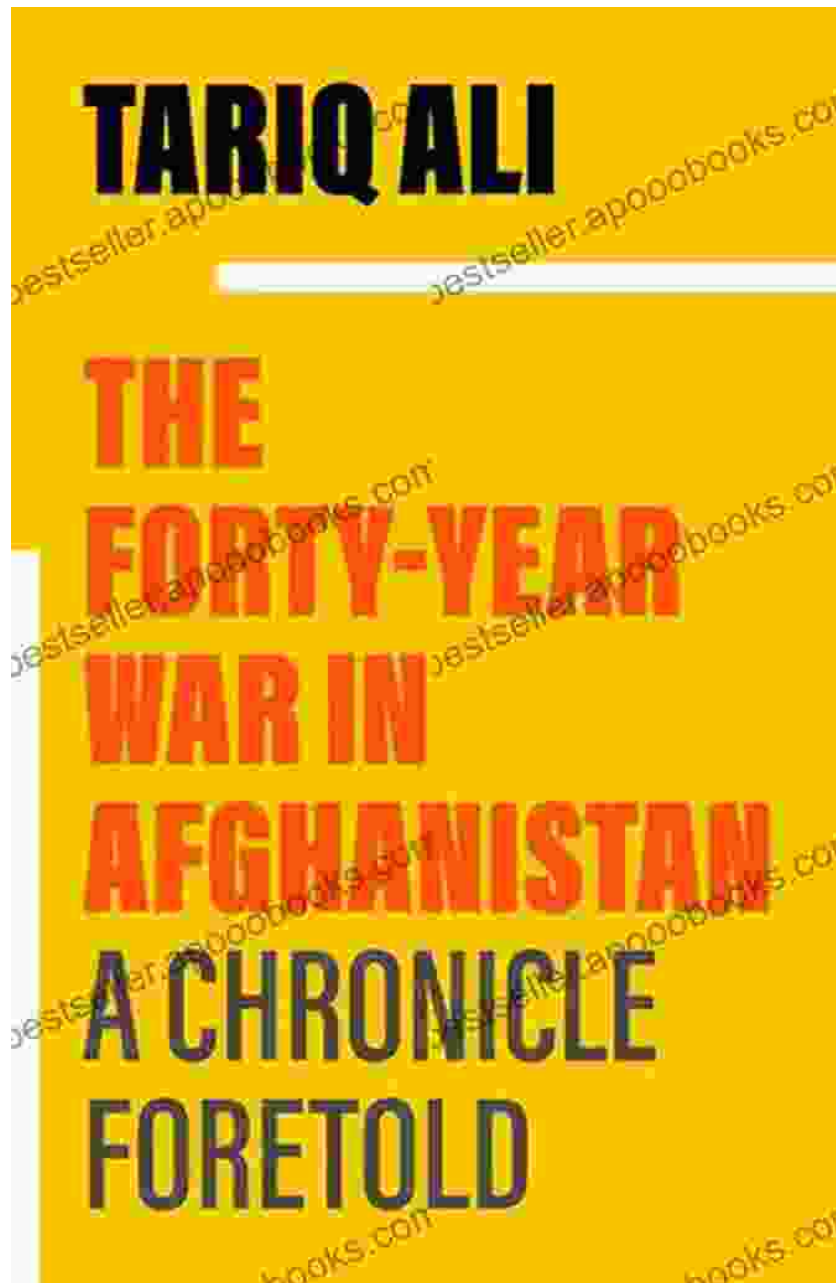


US soldiers in Afghanistan during the early stages of the War on Terror.

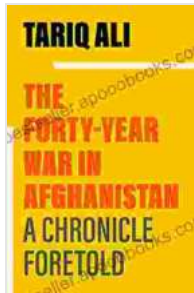

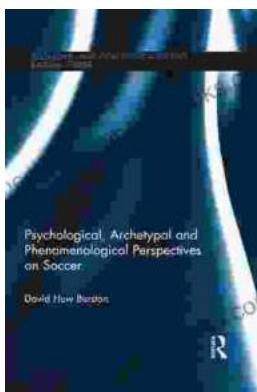
